






World cashmere resource /%/






Lack of coordination among government-academic institutions, universities, and private enterprises



Lack of opportunities in an international markets; the products produced by SMEs doesn't meet the quality and safety standards (ISO, HACCP)



SMEs default rate is high




Concessional Loan



In 2019, SMEDF granted loans to SMEs from 20million up to 1billion tugriks (\$7,400-\$370,000)


It is a 5 year loan with 3% annual interest rate, and the first year is a grace period.


